United Women in Faith, celebrated Assembly 2022 in Orlando, Florida. More than 3000 participated, in-person and, for the first time, on-line. 24 countries and all 50 states were represented for the "**Turn It Up!**" event.

Many came for the Ubuntu Day of Service, the day before Assembly 2022 began. Participants put together seed, meal and hygiene kits. Recipients were from local Florida outreach organizations including the Cornerstone Family Ministries, a United Women in Faith national mission institution.

Much gratitude for supporting the request of seeds!

I had a fun-packed weekend! Friends from the past & New Friends, Learning, Laughing, Singing, Dancing & most importantly getting re-ignited!

Representing CA NV, we had performances by our Fijian and Cambodian Sisters!

The weekend consisted of Community Gatherings, Town Hall Meetings and Workshops focused on soul care, leadership, and change-making, led by Fierce, Smart, Funny Powerful Speakers

- **Rev. Sung Yeon Choimorrow**, executive director of the National Asian Pacific American Women's Forum, spoke about the discrimination towards Asian American women, challenging actions of love, to change the path of racism.
- **Heather McTeer Toney**, lawyer and environmentalist speaking about caring for creation.
- **General Secretary Harriett Jane Olson**, spoke of the re-branding on March 3rd, of United Women in Faith. The national membership model is based on *Faith*, *Sisterhood and Action*.

Harriett encouraged us:

To learn, know & share:

the strength of our personal *spiritual, faith-based* roots the *impact* of telling our story thru the nimbleness of <u>virtual tools</u> the power of *connections, <u>ALL</u>* must know this is a safe place the commitment to *act*

- Creation of an "All Access" on-line membership.

- Need for Soul Care Retreats
- Inspiring, Collaborating, Leadership studies

- **U.S. Secretary of the interior Deb Haaland** also joined Assembly 2022 via video, speaking on the moral responsibility women of faith have when it comes to climate change, environmental reform and caring for the earth.
- Rev. YaNi spoke with unique, rapping, powerful poetry. She was AMAZING!
- National President 'Ainise 'Isama'u, as well as past National Presidents participated.
- Taking part also were United Methodist Bishops and United Methodist General Secretaries
- United Women in Faith's **Elizabeth Chun Hye Lee** and **Emily Jones** invited Assembly attendees to join in the organization's Just Energy for All and Interrupt the School-to-Prison Pipeline campaigns.

Attendees filled out post cards to be sent to elected representatives urging them to pass legislation that advances climate justice and helps protect children from racist policies in their schools.

Virtual attendees signed on-line petitions for "Clean Air as a Human Right," "Ending of Corporal Punishment in "Counseling not Criminalization in Schools" and "Help to End the School Pushout."

Assembly 2022 also featured two town halls focusing on United Women in Faith advocacy issues:

- "Restoring Just Relationships: The Critical Role of Just Transition Toward Climate Justice, Just Energy for All".
- I attended "For Such a Time As This: Racism, Antiracism and The United Methodist Church."

Workshops I attended:

"Letting go of Leadership: Passion vs Title" (take-away...passion can be a driving force)

"Leadership Development: A Necessity for a Change-Maker"

(take-away...self-assessment is a valuable tool for leadership)

Phenomenal music! Assembly 2022 featured an all-woman band. Their music complimented the mood and added to the message of each Community Gathering & service. We were not only dancing in our chairs, but also in the aisles!

The band also created their own song **"Turn It Up"**!

Reflections on Mission U at Monte Toyon

Upon arriving at Monte Toyon, I was at once struck by the beauty of the setting: the trees that shaded the walkways, the blue sky, the peacefulness, the way the buildings nestled into the site. This was going to be a relaxing weekend! And what a weekend it was! The schedule was relaxed. Martha Parker (the Dean) said we were on camp time right from the start.

Martha Parker and Kalesita Fa'asisila (the Deans) did a wonderful job in planning. There were two

adult sessions: in English let by Justin Ryu of New Creation UMC in Campbell and in Fijian led by Iva Turaga the President of the Bay District. Both leaders were truly inspirational and guided us through our study titled "Who Can We be Together." Our biblical reference was Luke 13.

The music was led by Pastor Fel Cao and his band from Riverside UMC in Sacramento. He very capably led us in singing God's praises and asking Him for guidance as we work through the challenges of life. Thanks, Pastor Fel and Angelina!

This session was different from earlier Mission u's that I have attended in that it included many youth and children. They were certainly a blessing. They had their own study leaders and had plenty of time for games and fun also but always joined us for worship and at meal times. (The food was really good too!)



At the closing study session, the Fijian women shared their stories of how the Lord has worked in their lives illustrating that a small mustard seed of their faith has grown into a mighty tree. I am inspired by their witness to do what I can to grow our Untied Women in Faith and that the Holy spirit will turn my small deeds into something big!

Our closing prayer: (From the study book page 34¹)

Dear God.

You are the architect of this world. You built it to sustain life. You were intentional about the greenery, the waters, the animals, the distance from the sun, the diverse range of humans.

We have been swindled into believing that there are only enough resources among us for some of us to have a quality experience. We sometimes believe that the church is a club that we can keep others out of, whether we say if firmly or politely.

So, convict us, dear Lord. Show us the beauty of the more expansive church, right here and now. Teach us to be open to the movement of the Holy Spirit, which moves like a breath and like a rushing wind. Fast or slow, the Spirit is always hard to capture and pin down. The Spirit is always ready to invigorate what we once knew to be true. Glory to God for new revelations every day.

In April, Terri Koike and Laurie Lindsey had a Zoom meeting with Barbara Taylor, who is the Santa Cruz ambassador for Dress-A-Girl Around the World. Barbara was so helpful and inspiring to both of us. She reiterated the mission:

"We endeavor to raise the esteem of girls living in poverty around the world by providing them with a made-with-lots-of-love, well-constructed, beautiful dress."

Barbara also gave us some helpful guidelines and arranged for us to have "kits", which the Santa Cruz organization had previously put together. The kits were so helpful, since the material was already selected, cut and serged together and the trims were included.

Barbara mentioned that they use the sewing of dresses as a "prayer activity", praying for each girl that will receive a dress.

To date, the Wesley United Women in Faith have completed 43

dresses, including 14 infant dresses from kits. The dresses will be blessed by the outgoing pastors at Wesley UMC on Sunday, June 5. Several women in the Wesley UWF have expressed an interest in continuing this project.



Book Review: Who Can We Be Together, by Candace Simpson

What does God say about creating spaces of care? About community building? About shifting boundaries and norms? And how can this be done when the entire world seems to be on fire? These are some topics addressed in this year's Mission u textbook. It delves into Luke 13 to help readers develop faith, both personally and collectively, through an anti-oppression lens.



Each of the eight chapters of this book includes Bible commentary, group activities, discussion questions and thoughts for reflection. It is designed to be studied with a group, either online or in person, but could also be read individually. If you are attending Mission u, you will have the opportunity to cover all of this material. If not, I'd challenge you to form a group within your unit to do the study together.

Communications Update

This quarter, you will note that the form of the Mission Link has changed again. Hopefully, we are zeroing in on something that will work for everyone:

- We want to retain the management of the mailing list by Mailchimp. This is much less error prone than manually maintaining a list.
- We listened and determined that many members still prefer to have a printable .pdf file, rather than lots of links. This will enable printing of the entire newsletter. It can be used as a recruiting tool (on bulletin boards, etc.) and it also enables printing of only the articles you are interested in (by selecting the section of interest and then printing it.)
- We want to be able to archive the newsletters in a way that preserves the entire content. A
 PDF file that contains whole articles, rather than a small paragraph with links, meets that
 objective.

That said, we cannot actually attach a PDF file to a Mailchimp mailing. So, there is link to the pdf file in the Mailchimp distribution. You will be able to access the newsletter by clicking on that link. From there, you can read or print.

Since I also need to work on the rebranding, I will be doing some work on the website over the summer. I will run the proposed changes past our district team prior to implementing them.
